Last week, we were honored to receive the Governor's Award for Historic Preservation for activities at the Warner Homestead. This is the first time a historic preservation project in Livingston County has been represented. The Warner Homestead was nominated for the restoration of the 1855 Greek Revival home and 1849 Hicks school, archaeological research, and a variety outreach initiatives. Five other historic restoration projects from around the state were also recipients this year.
